National Immunization Awareness Month

Vaccines aren't just for kids. Adults may need vaccines to protect against whooping cough, flu, pneumonia, and shingles. Ask your doctor about vaccines you may need for your age, health conditions, job, or lifestyle.

Vaccines work with your body's natural defenses to help safely develop protection from diseases.

Every year thousands of adults in the U.S. become seriously

ill and are hospitalized because of diseases that vaccines can help prevent. Many adults even die from these diseases. By getting vaccinated, you can help protect yourself and your family from serious, sometimes deadly, diseases.

It is especially important for patients with chronic health conditions to be up to date on recommended vaccinations, since they are at increased risk for complications from certain vaccine-preventable diseases. Talk to your doctor or nurse to make sure you haven't missed any recommended vaccines.

We also encourage you to visit CDC's <u>Interactive</u> <u>Vaccine Guide</u>, which provides information on the vaccines recommended throughout your life.


